What is Your Voice, Your Town?



Encouraging community involvement in local decision-making, by:

- Empowering residents to lead changes in their neighbourhoods.
- Community collaboration, where more people can partner up in local communities to deliver improvements.
- Supporting communities to do more of what they want to do to support their neighbourhoods and town.

How did Your Voice, Your Town take shape?



Feedback from residents, through surveys and at more than 40 face to face events helped to build Your Voice, Your Town. People from across the 7 towns shared:

The great things that are already happening in their community

That they need to believe they can trust the council

Their hopes for the future of their towns, and how a little support from Ealing Council and their community could help them to do so much more.

The importance of bringing people together to help their towns thrive.


What has happened so far?

Town Ballot

- People voted for their local town priority from the list of categories that had been compiled from resident feedback.
- Ealing's Community Engagement Team visited many locations across the borough to encourage people to vote
- Clean and pleasant area was voted as Acton's priority

Town Priority Workshops

- People came together to define their town priority and to seek consensus
- The information gathered will be shared with the Town Team, to influence project delivery and action to support the town priority



Collective Statements

Participants from the workshop came up with the following collective statements:



Cultural coming together for common cooperation in spaces that are green and free of rubbish and where people can feel safe and illegal activity has been much reduced and can be reported on effectively and anonymously and more public toilets.
